The S.E.O. noted that the council was aware of the issue of capacity at several burial grounds in the district and advised that steps were being taken to ensure that there would be provision into the future.

I am calling on Cork County Council housing department to cut the bushes send overgrowth behind and between the estates of Slip Lawn and An Fanan Bantry.

Report from Ruth O'Brien S.E.E. - The Housing Department have confirmed that a contractor has been engaged and the works are in progress.

## **ANY OTHER BUSINESS**

In response for an update on the planned works at Chapel Street, Mr. J. Ahern S.E.E. advised that tenders were due back by 3<sup>rd</sup> November and a plan for the works would drafted shortly thereafter.

In response for an update on the Ballineen Public Toilets the S.E.O. advised members that monies had been set aside for design and quotes would be sought by year end.

In relation to a request for barriers at Shiplake Mr. John Ahern S.E.E. noted that as no structures on the lake side were available to install a barrier that a bun was installed at this location.

Both road engineers noted the reported issue of Japanese Knot Weed between the Ballydehob Playschool and the 12 Arch Bridge and will investigate same and at the R596 Lake Cross outside Skibbereen.

In relation to the request for the Bere Island slipway to be powerwashed Mr. R. O'Brien noted the matter for review.

Mr. R O'Brien noted the request for hedgegrows to be cut back around road signage on the Goleen and Mizen roads.

In response for an update on the Family Resource Centre discussions on a new premises the
S.E.O. noted that there had been a meeting with the group and representatives of the
Council including the Divisional Manager and the group were asked to pursue the provision
of accommodation with their funding authorities – the HSE and Tusla.

The S.E.O. advised that online meeting with Community Groups would be made available during December prior to the online grants process beginning in the new year.
