Councillor Gobnait Moynihan

(a) <u>Disabled Parking Bay, Macroom</u>

Cllr. Moynihan said that a large Disabled parking space, possibly across from Matt Murphy's Chemist, Middle Square is required in order to facilitate the exiting of wheelchairs. J. Dwyer, SEE said he would investigate.

Councillor Michael Creed

(a) Terelton – School Speed Warning Signs

Cllr. Creed confirmed that the local community would be able to make a contribution. J. Dwyer, SEE said he would make contact with the community.

(b) <u>Incorrect Irish Spelling for Sign in Rusheen</u>

J. Dwyer, SEE said the sign was damaged and would be replaced. Cllr. Moynihan said the Irish spelling on the sign was incorrect and should be rectified. J. Dwyer, SEE said he would investigate.

 A O'Brien, EE said it was on the list of works to be done in the next few weeks.
- (i) <u>Bus Stop on the Killarney Road, Macroom</u> J. Dwyer, SEE said he is meeting with Bus Eireann.

 M. O'Leary, MDO said that she had requested consultants to carry out an inspection. She hopes she will have an update for the next meeting.
- (a) <u>Drain at Crookstown Hall</u>
 J. Dwyer, SEE said it is on the list of works.

Councillor Eileen Lynch

(a) <u>Ballygibbon Cross/Waterloo Junction – Camera Survey</u>

Cllr. Lynch expressed her disappointment that according to P. Barrett, DOS Cork County Council were considering the closure of the N20 Waterloo Junction. She agreed that illegal manoeuvres were taking place and requested that Cork County Council write to T.I.I. seeking a U Turn at Ballygibbon Cross. She also asked that Members are kept up to date with developments.

Cllr. Moynihan said there was huge support from the community to prevent the closure. She said a U Turn sign was needed and that Cork County Council needs to work with the community and the Gardai.

N. Radley, SEO informed the Members that P. Barrett, Director of Services never stated that the junction will be closed.

The Members were informed that following the boundary alteration this area is no longer in Macroom Municipal District.

- (b) <u>Lee Valley Pub, Dripsey</u> <u>Derelict/Dangerous Building Update</u> A O'Brien, EE said that he would have a report for the next meeting.
- (c) Courtbrack Village New Housing Development coming from Blarney Signage/Road Lining

 A O'Brien, EE said that a survey is to be carried out by the NNRDO for a detailed design to be completed.

Councillor Martin Coughlan

J. Dwyer, SEE said that the NNRDO were carrying out traffic surveys but that he had no update.

(b) O'Riadas Carpark, Macroom – Bank falling into the river

J. Dwyer, SEE said that the Consultants report was nearly complete and it was hoped to go to tender by the end of the year. Cllr. Coughlan enquired if the surface could be looked at. J. Dwyer, SEE said that once the bank was repaired that would follow on.

2. Consideration of the Draft Budgetary Plan for Macroom Municipal District

Members noted the Municipal District Draft Budgetary Plan for 2020

- M. O'Leary, MDO explained that this was a draft budget for Macroom Municipal District and that Members would be voting on the overall budget at the Full Council Meeting.
- N. Radley, SEO said that this was the first budget for Macroom Municipal District. She said the budget had been increased in most of the areas and this was very positive.

All Members welcomed the budget.

Cllr. G. Moynihan

- Reduction in Litter Management N. Radley SEO said figures are determined by per head of population.
- Street Cleaning disappointing to see a reduction villages need cleaning, not just the town.
- Town Development Fund rules can be strict no leeway for towns to develop themselves

Cllr. M. Coughlan

 Disappointed with the lack of staff available to carry out street cleaning in Macroom. N. Radley, SEO said that staff issues were an Executive function and could not be discussed at Municipal District meetings but she would progress his request of additional staff.
