 M. O'Brien, Exec. Architect gave a detailed presentation to the Members outlining proposed plans.

• Stone was agreed at the back of the church

M. O'Brien, Exec. Architect said she was not aware of the stone facing on the
extension and said that this would be considered as the project enters detailed
design stage.

• Dome at the top of the tower – *looking into making it accessible to the public*

Councillor Gobnait Moynihan

What is meant by flexible commercial community space?

N. Radley, SEO outlined that this space will a flexible community and commercial space that could have many uses and we are reluctant to define it for any specific purpose as it will be for the community

Is this part of the Millstream project?

N. Radley, SEO confirmed that yes this project forms part of an RRDF application for both the Mill Dam Masseytown Project and this project.

Is there universal access?

M. O'Brien, Exec. Architect said that there will be universal access to the main space, but that the upper tower and rear extension are considered as semi-public spaces and not accessible by all building users.

- Is there changing facilities for an adult is the toilet big enough
 - M. O'Brien, Exec. Architect said there is an enlarged universally accessible WC and standard unisex WC. Given the intended use of the building, changing facilities wouldn't be seen as required.
- Is there a lift lift access would not be feasible within building's existing footprint
- <u>Timeframe what is the next step</u>

M. O'Brien Exec. Architect said a timeline could not be given as funding is not yet in place. Consultants cannot be appointed to progress the project until funding has been secured.

Public Consultation – Christmas is a bad time

M. O'Brien, Exec. Architect said this can be submitted in January.

N. Radley, SEO said she had no issue with that but that due process would be followed regardless of when it is published.

How will the construction traffic enter the site?

M. O'Brien, EA said the entrance will be through the main gates – she said there will be very limited material going through the gates.

Councillor Ted Lucey

Is this part of the Mill Dam project?

N. Radley, SEO said this was part of the RRDF application – same project as the Mill Dam but a separate Part VIII planning application.

 M. O'Leary, MDO said that some additional funding had been received from the Dept and the successful applicants will be notified if they have been granted an increase to their grant over the coming days.

In response to Cllr Lucey regarding appealing the decisions, J. Dwyer, SEE said that TII ultimately have the final say in the national routes. It was proposed by Cllr. Lucey and seconded by Cllr. Moynihan that the comments from the elected Members were noted in the return.

J Dwyer, SEE explained that it currently anticipated to keep the present speed limit at Coolcower (at present at 80 km) with the area being reviewed when the bypass works are complete and the road designation will change back to a regional road status.

L-3409 - Clondrohid

Cllr. Lucey said this was a narrow road. J. Dwyer, SEE said he would raise this with the TII .

Cllr. Gobnait Moynihan

- In response to Cllr. Moynihan, J. Dwyer, SEE said that this was advertised publicly and submissions were received.

Cllr. Moynihan said that a lot of people are not obeying the speed limit and that the Speed Actuation Signs have made a difference. She said that installing ramps in villages should be investigated.
