Councillor Gobnait Moynihan

- (a) Ballyvourney to Killarney Road lag on road start date
 J. Dwyer, SEE outlined that the contract has been awarded and works should commence next month. In response to Cllr. Moynihan, J. Dwyer, SEE confirmed that the road will not be closed.
- (b) <u>Ballyvourney</u> speed on the N22 by the Mills Inn Cllr. Moynihan suggested writing to An Garda Síochána for their views.

- (a) <u>Ballingeary</u> road into the village very bad state J. Dwyer, SEE said this is on the 2020 Programme of Works.

- (a) <u>Kilmurry Cemetery</u> rubbish being dumped Cllr. Coughlan said that rubbish was being thrown over the walls into the cemetery. J. Dwyer, SEE to investigate.
- (b) <u>Terelton to Reanacaheragh Road</u> potholes
- (c) Toonsbridge road lining needs to be refreshed
 Cllr. Coughlan said a directional arrow is required on the Macroom side of the bridge . J. Dwyer, SEE said he would arrange to have the lining refreshed and erect signs.
- (d) Town Park, Macroom "Dogs must be kept on a lead" sign required Cllr. Coughlan said there was a big problem with unleashed dogs in Macroom Town Park. He said as this was not a public place, the Dog Warden had no authority to monitor this area. N. Radley, SEO said a meeting is being organised with the Town Park Trustees and she will raise this issue with them.
- (e) <u>Cobble Stones at the Castle Gates, Macroom</u> Cllr. Coughlan said the loose stones were covered in green moss and holding water.

Councillor Ted Lucey

- (a) Filter Light coming out of Masseytown heading Towards Killarney
 Cllr. Lucey asked if a filter light could be installed for traffic exiting Masseytown at
 the junction turning right. He said this is a dangerous junction as the pedestrian
 crossing is located adjacent to it on New Street and there has been a number of
 incidents on the crossing.
- (b) Beal na Blath to Crookstown speed
 Cllr. Lucey queried if a vehicle actuated sign could be installed. J. Dwyer, SEE said he will carry out a speed survey on the area.
- (c) <u>Killumney Road to Begley's Forge</u> possibility of road being salted
 J. Dwyer, SEE said it was not on a priority route and therefore not on current salting programme.
- (d) <u>Laneway on left from Macroom going towards Coachford</u> poor visibility when exiting and turning right for Macroom.
 - J. Dwyer, SEE to investigate.

- (e) <u>Local Improvement Schemes</u> provision of additional schemes

 J. Dwyer, SEE said the amount of schemes provided was totally dependent on available funding.
- (f) Ros Alainn Estate, Macroom 5 to 6 street lights out of order in estate J. Dwyer, SEE to write to the receivers.

- (a) <u>Road behind Ballinagree School</u> (from grotto to school) dangerous J. Dwyer, SEE said this is on the 2021 Programme of Works
- (b) Pedestrian Crossing, Coachford from O'Callaghan's pub to supermarket
 J. Dwyer, SEE said once the Sewerage Scheme is finished, Cork County Council has committed to looking at what works are required in the village and at that point it will be considered.
- (c) <u>Stuake, Donoughmore</u> vehicle actuated sign J. Dwyer, SEE said he will arrange to carry out a speed survey
- (d) <u>Fr. Patrick Sheehan Place, Coachford</u> (behind Coachford school) lack of parking Cllr. Lynch said that lining is required in order to create more parking spaces.
- (e) Road from Upper Cloghroe to the Shebeen Pub potholes
- (f) <u>Dripsey Cross to Model Village at Feeneys Pub</u> gulley on a height water gathers at the cross
