3. General Municipal Allocation & Town Development Fund

A total of 91 applications were received by the Macroom MD in respect of the 2023 Community Fund Scheme. The total value of applications received was €1,525,007 while the allocation under the Community Fund 2023 is €197,253.

A meeting will be held in Coachford in the coming weeks to agree the enhancements for the village under this Scheme.


5. 2023 Historic Towns Initiative – Stream 2 Application for Macroom

Under the 2023 Historic Towns Initiative Stream 2 Macroom Municipal District made an application for funding towards a Heritage Led Regeneration Plan for New Street & Castle Street in Macroom. I am pleased to inform you that this application has been successful and has been awarded funding of €40,000 to develop this plan.

This plan will highlight the current assets in the area & will aim enhance the natural beauty of these streets in a planned & measured manner. Streets like New Street and Castle Street have been unable to develop to their potential because of the sustained traffic. This is now an opportune time to look at these streets, assess the heritage & historic value of them & develop a plan which could be replicated in any other town in the Municipal District, in Cork County or even nationally. Macroom town is similar to other towns of its size but it has some lovely unique historic features and natural assets already, so the plan is to highlight current assets in the area & to enhance its natural beauty in a planned & measured manner.

Updates on progress with this plan will issue over the coming months. This project will be due for completed by mid-November 2023.
